Emergency Measures Organization (EMO) – Volunteers Needed

The Village of Muenster is seeking 3–5 volunteers to participate in the first phase of training for our Emergency Measures Organization (EMO).

Under Section 9 of the Emergency Planning Act (1989), all local authorities in Saskatchewan are required to establish an emergency planning committee to support preparedness, community emergency response coordination, and recovery planning. As a member the Humboldt Emergency ofPlanning District (HEPD), our municipality is working to align with regional training, planning, and exercise initiatives in 2026 2027.

Please note: We are not recruiting firefighters or police. We are looking for individuals who can stay calm under pressure, follow established procedures, access prepared resources, assist with communications, and help keep information and resources moving during an emergency. Existing plans and tools include clear checklists, duties, and reference materials.

Because all HEPD communities follow consistent procedures, trained volunteers may also be called upon to support neighbouring communities if a major incident occurs.

Why Your Involvement Matters

Your experience and insight contribute directly to:

- Protecting residents and infrastructure
- Ensuring continuity of essential services
- Supporting coordinated response decisions
- Managing risk during emergencies

Committee Responsibilities:

- Reviewing and supporting the municipal Emergency Response Plan
- Identifying local hazards and critical infrastructure
- Advising on resource needs and priorities
- Offering sector-specific expertise during activations
- Supporting community recovery efforts

Training & Participation Expectations:

• Attend quarterly meetings (60–90 minutes)

- •Participate in HEPD's 2026 training sessions understand the Local Planning Committee role (time commitments are minimal and scheduled in advance)
- •Participate in **2027 district-wide** validation exercises, offering a low-stress opportunity to apply training in realistic scenarios
- •Provide updates and recommendations within your area of responsibility

These activities help strengthen our community's resilience *before* an incident occurs.

Winter Safety & Snowfall Reminder- Helpful Practices

Water Meter Puck - Access Reminder

Please ensure there is a **clear path to your water meter puck** so it can be accessed for reading at the end of the month.

If access is not possible, please take a photo of your water meter and email it to muenster@sasktel.net by the last day of the month. This will allow us to complete an actual reading rather than an estimate.



Snow Clearing Tips for Residents

After heavy snowfall, residents can help the Village's snow removal crew by following these best practices:

•Push snow well back into your yard when clearing your driveway.

Ensure piles are set far enough back so they do not impede the grader. By pushing driveway snow deep into your yard rather toward the road, residents help prevent future hauling costs

• Avoid piling snow high along the road.

When large, hardened piles develop, the grader cannot push through them. As winter progresses, there is limited room to move new snow off the street.

Your cooperation helps maintain safe roads, reduces strain on equipment, and supports cost effective snow management throughout the season.

Check Your Exterior Heat Vents

After a significant snowfall or cold snap, Muenster residents are strongly encouraged to **check exterior heat vents** for snow and ice buildup to ensure they are not blocked. A blocked vent can cause **carbon monoxide** to back up into your home, creating a serious safety risk.

Stay safe this winter by taking a moment to clear vents and review your home's safety equipment.

Snow Removal Policy

Please refrain from parking vehicles on streets **during/after snowfalls**. The grader will do a much better job if they can pass free of obstacles.

A snow removal map is attached and will identify priority streets and removal responsibility.

Village of Muenster — 2025 Snow Clearing Policy

As another busy winter approaches, the Village would like to remind residents of a few important practices that help keep snow-clearing operations safe, efficient, and cost-effective for everyone.

To help our community and snow-clearing crews:

• Pile snow as far onto your yard as possible.

Space is limited during the winter months. Keeping snow well within your property ensures the grader has room to push up the banks.

Do not shovel or blow snow onto the road.

Doing so creates hazards for your neighbours, the snow can freeze and damage municipal equipment, and slows down snow-clearing crews who must re-clear affected roads.

• Wait to clear your driveway when possible.

If the grader has not yet passed, you are more likely to be left with a ridge across the end of your driveway.

• Pile snow on the correct (downstream) side of your driveway.

The grader pushes snow in the direction of traffic flow. Placing your snow on the downstream side helps prevent the grader from pushing it back into your driveway.

Lend a hand to your neighbours.

Small acts of kindness make a big difference during the long winter months.

Keep parked vehicles off the street when snow is expected.

This allows crews to clear roads fully and safely.

Snow removal is completed in the following order of priority:

- 1. **Priority 1:** Rangeline Rd, Railway St, College Ave, EMS, Wolverine Heights
- 2. Priority 2: Main St, Taphorn St, Phillips St, Scott St, First Ave, Second Ave, Third Ave
- 3. Priority 3: Phillips Place, Main Bay, Scott Bay, Phillips Bay, Main Crescent
- 4. **Priority 4:** Ridges, Alley work, Bays parking
- 5. **Priority 5:** St. Peter's College and Abbey
- 6. **Priority 6:** St. Peter's Parish Rd

Thank you for helping keep our community safe, accessible, and welcoming throughout the winter season. Your efforts truly make a difference for your neighbours and for the crews working hard to keep Muenster moving.
